This funding not only provided a financial boost but also validated their dream. In February 2023, they opened their shop, creating a space for the community to celebrate wine and connection while contributing to Richmond's vibrant culture and economy.

2024 has been a year of tremendous growth for CIC. We've significantly increased our microlending, empowering more entrepreneurs to turn their ideas into reality.

Our signature 16-week workshop has expanded to Culpeper, bringing vital business education to a new community. We've also taken our first steps into southern Virginia, extending our reach to support even more aspiring business owners.

This expansion represents not just growth but a deepening of our commitment to fostering economic opportunity across our region and state. While we celebrate these achievements, we recognize that our work is far from over. The need for accessible entrepreneurship support continues to grow, especially among our target communities, including low to
